WEEK 1

These homework sheets are designed to be a guide on what training to cover week by week, gradually building on each exercise. It is important not to skip steps so your dog has the best chance of understanding and being able to be successful at each exercise.

Progress through at your dog's pace, keeping to short training sessions split up through the day when your dog is awake, remember your dog needs lots of rest too.

Play and sleep after sessions can help consolidate learning.

Habituation - intro to safe novel objects - set up in familiar room e.g. the kitchen with treats in/around for them to find at their own pace, supervise	 Different textures e.g. doormat, rubber mat, baking tray Washing basket on it's side Stacked up cushions Low sided box with towel etc in Chair with blanket/sheet over it Opened umbrella on the floor 	
Toy play – tug with a long or large soft toy on the ground, finishing with treats dropped on floor or other calm activity	During play sessions	
Attention exercise - positive interrupter cue 'watch me', lure this by taking a treat from their nose up to your eye or chin, practice in a range of contexts	 Lounge Kitchen Garden On lead on a walk When needing to interrupt something To get the lead on 	
Mat settle- with their lead on, nice and slack under your foot, small rewards dropped onto their mat when your dog is stood, sat or lying down on it	 While sat on sofa While sat at a table While you are reading/on computer While you are eating 	
Recall -Step back, recall cue, catch and reward (gently taking collar at the same time as rewarding), practice in a range of locations	 Lounge Kitchen Garden On lead on a walk On long line Off lead in a secure area 	
Drop and swap - hands come to give not takeaway, with a handful of tasty treats, say 'drop' to request they swap what they have, Hansel and Gretel trail them away from item, practice with a range of items	 Plastic toy Soft toy Chew Every item they have 'stolen'
